I KNOW all MEN by these PRESENTS, That we Joseph Putnam 3<sup>d</sup> & Daniel Putnam of Danvers, in the County of Essex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, yeoman, in consideration of deeds of release which Eben Dale of said Danvers has delivered to us of two pieces of land lying in Middleton and Andover, the Receipt whereof we do here by acknowledge, have remised released and forever quitclaimed, and do for our selves and our heirs by these PRESENTS remise release, release, and forever quitclaim unto the said Joseph Putnam and Daniel Putnam their heirs and assigns, all our right, title & interest that we have in or unto a tract of woodland situate in Middleton, and part in Andover, containing five acres and ninety three poles and is bounded as follows, to wit, beginning at the North westerly corner thereof by land of Capt. Joseph Symonds and the heirs of Moses Kimball dec<sup>d</sup> thence running Southeasterly twenty one rods, and twelve links to stake and stones, thence running Southerly by land the said Dale and I the said Joseph Putnam have this day acquired to Daniel Putnam above mentioned fifty three rods and about ten links to a Stake and stones by Moses Kimball's heirs land, thence running westerly by said heirs land as the fence stands seventeen rods and five links to a Stake and stones, and thence running northeasterly Northwestly and northerly by said heirs land about eighty three rods as the fence stands to the corner first mentioned. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the aforesaid premises with all the privileges and appurtenances therunto belonging to him the said Eben Dale his heirs and assigns forever, so that neither we the said Joseph Putnam and Daniel Putnam nor our heirs or any other Person or Persons claiming from or under us or them, or in the name right or stead of us or them, shall or will by any way or means have, claim, or demand any right or title to the aforesaid Premises or their appurtenances, or to any part or parcel thereof forever. IN WITNESS whereof we the said Joseph Putnam and Daniel Putnam have hereunto set our hands and seals this thirtieth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen.

I KNOW all MEN by these PRESENTS, That I Daniel Putnam, of Danvers, in the County of Essex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, yeoman, in consideration of a deed of release which Joseph Putnam 3<sup>d</sup> of Danvers aforesaid yeoman, has this day signed and delivered to me of a tract of woodland situate in Boxford, containing two acres and three quarters, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge and for divers other good causes and considerations me hereto moving, do hereby remise, release, and forever quitclaim unto the said Joseph Putnam to his heirs and assigns forever, all my right title and interest that I have in or unto a tract of woodland situate in Boxford, in said County of Essex containing two acres and three quarters more or less, which is bounded as follows viz. beginning at the Northeastly corner of said lot at a stake &
