The above courses and distances being from a survey made Dec. 7 A.D. 1875 by Andrew Nichols Surveyor, it being the same land conveyed to me by William Sutton by deed the 20th of April 1876. To have and to hold the granted premises, with all the privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging, to the said John La Killam and his heirs and assigns, to their own use and behoof forever.
