Dear Applicant:

The Natural Heritage & Endangered Species Program of the Massachusetts Division of Fisheries & Wildlife (the "Division") received the MESA Project Review Checklist, projects plans entitled "DRAFT PLAN OF NATIONAL HERITAGE & ENDANGERED SPECIES AREA" (dated September 25, 2015, revised October 27, 2015; prepared by Christiansen & Sergi, Inc.; the "Project Plan"), and other required materials for review pursuant to the Massachusetts Endangered Species Act (M.G.L. c. 131A) and its implementing regulations (321 CMR 10.00) (MESA).

The Division has determined that portions of the proposed project are located within the mapped habitat of the Blanding's Turtle (*Emydoidea blandingii*), a species state-listed as "Threatened." This species and its habitats are protected pursuant to the MESA. A Fact Sheet for this species can be found on our website, www.mass.gov/nhesp.

As proposed, the project includes the construction of a seven (7) lot residential subdivision, access road and drives, grading, utilities, and stormwater management structures on a ±17.91-acre lot (Wellington Way and Lots 1-7, Open Space A, and Open Space B; Book 5407, Page 47, Essex County North Registry of Deeds), as shown on the Project Plan. The project also includes construction of two (2) additional Form A residential dwellings and associated site work on two additional lots (Boxford Street, Lot 1 and Lot 2) totaling ±4 acres (Book 14223, Page 282, Essex County North Registry of Deeds), as shown on the Project Plan. In total, the project will result in ±6.2 acres of disturbance (hereinafter, the "Work") on a ±21.92-acre property (the "Property").

The Division understands that the Applicant intends to permanently protect ±11.04 acres of land, as shown on the Project Plan (labeled "Open Space B") through a Conservation Restriction conveyed to the Town of North Andover Conservation Commission or another qualified land trust, nonprofit organization or government entity. The Applicant has also proposed to protect an additional ±4.13 acres of land located on each of the individual lots through a Division-approved Declaration of Restriction. Collectively, the Applicant is proposing to protect ±15.17 acres of land as open space and rare species habitat (the "Open Space"), as shown on the Project Plan. The Applicant is also

from roads and other developed areas.

Based on the information provided and the information contained in our database, the Division has determined that this project, as currently proposed, must be conditioned in order to avoid a prohibited

"take" of state-listed species (321 CMR 10.18(2)(a)). The project must adhere to the following conditions:

proposing to install permanent markers and signs to physically demarcate the boundaries of the Open Space, and to eliminate road curbing associated with Wellington Way to ensure that turtles may escape

- 1. Prior to the start of Work, or as otherwise approved by the Division, the Applicant shall:
 - a. Record this determination letter and the Project Plan in the Essex County North Registry of Deeds or the Land Court for the district in which the Property is located so as to become a record part of the chain of title of the Property, and provide the Division with proof of said recordation.
 - b. Implement the Blanding's Turtle Protection Plan referenced above. Any changes to said Plan must be submitted to the Division for review and written approval prior to implementation of said changes.
 - c. Install symbolic flagging along portions of the Open Space boundary abutting at the limits of Work shown on the Project Plan, and provide the Division with proof of said installation. Said flagging shall be maintained throughout the construction period.
- 2. Within three (3) months of the start of Work, or as otherwise approved by the Division, the Applicant shall:
 - a. Install permanent markers and signs in accordance with the Project Plan. Said markers and signs shall be maintained in good condition and repaired or replaced, as necessary. A Massachusetts Registered Land Surveyor shall certify to the Division in writing that said markers and signs have been installed in accordance with the Project Plan and that no work has occurred within the Open Space.
 - b. Record a Division-approved Declaration of Restriction over the portion of the Open Space located on individual lots (totaling ±4.13 acres), and provide the Division with proof of said recordation.
- 3. Within six (6) months of the start of Work, or as otherwise approved by the Division, the Applicant shall provide proof of having protected "Open Space B" (totaling ±11.04 acres) through a Division-approved Conservation Restriction and/or another mechanism reviewed and approved in writing by the Division.
- 4. Any mechanized maintenance (e.g. mowing, etc.) of stormwater management systems associated with Wellington Woods shall occur during the turtle inactive season (October 15 November 1), unless otherwise approved in writing by the Division.

Provided the above-noted conditions are fully implemented and there are no changes to the Project Plan, this project will not result in a "take" of state-listed species. This determination is a final decision of the Division of Fisheries and Wildlife pursuant to 321 CMR 10.18. Any changes to the proposed project or any additional work beyond that shown on the Project Plan may require an additional filing with the Division pursuant to the MESA. This project may be subject to further review if no physical work is commenced within five years from the date of issuance of this determination, or if there is a change to the project. The Division notes that all work is subject to the anti-segmentation provisions (321 CMR 10.16) of the MESA.

Please note that this determination addresses only the matter of state-listed species and their habitats.
